JLIFE[for sho, hichiriki and glass chimes was written in autumn 2004 in Mariou on the Greek island of Crete, a work commissioned both by the hichiriki player Hitomi Nakamura and by the sho player Mayumi Miyata.

The piece is inspired by a poem fragment by the ancient Greek woman poet Sappho, the lyrics being whisperd by the two performing artists. Today, not all elements of the original are known but the American poet Anne Carson created a congenial version of the fragment:
